The Claiborne Parish Police Jury met in a legally convened regular session in the Jury Chambers of the Police Jury Complex, located at 507 West Main Street in Homer, LA at 9:00 a.m. on the fifth day of March 2014. On being called to order by President Scott Davidson, the following jurors were present:

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by Roy Lewis, the Jury unanimously approved the Parish's 2014 Assurance Letter to the DOTD for participation in any transportation project administered by the DOTD in which Federal dollars are used. Secretary-Treasurer Woodard told the Jury this is required annual.

President Scott Davidson read the notice prepared by the LSU AgCenter, the population estimation for July 1, 2013 for Claiborne Parish is 16,758 for the year.

At this time, the Jury set the date for March 31, 2014 at 3:00 p.m. for the evaluation of the submissions received for the Statement of Qualifications for Architectural Services for the proposed new CPSO administrative facility. Secretary-Treasurer Woodard told the Jury the submissions are due on Friday, March 14, 2014. The Jurors will discuss them on the March 31, 2014 committee meeting during which Parish Engineer Brad Graff or Randall Smoak will help answer any questions.

President Scott Davidson informed the Jurors that according to the Secretary of State's Office the appointment of Ms. Stephanie Sanders made during the February meeting for the Justice of the Peace position to replace Mr. Chuck Clawson was invalid. He also stated the State Supreme Court will be making the appointment and that the candidate for this position will be ineligible to run for the vacant office in the fall of 2014.

There was no motion on the requests from Claiborne Council on Aging, Lori Bolling regarding back door trash pickups within the Town of Homer lines for Ms. Willie Mae Carter and Ms. Margery Compton. Due to no motion the request died on the table and it will not be placed back on the agenda. President Scott Davidson asked Secretary-Treasurer Woodard to write a letter to the Claiborne Council on Aging stating that all requests regarding back door trash pick- up for residences within the town's city limits be sent to the Town of Homer.
