MINUTES

Of the Regular Meeting of The Claiborne Parish Police Jury December 9, 2015 Homer, LA 71040

The Claiborne Parish Police Jury met in regular session in the Jury Chambers of the Claiborne Parish Police Jury Complex, located at 507 West Main Street in Homer, LA at 10:00 a.m. on the Ninth day of December, 2015. On being called to order by President, Scott Davidson, the following jurors were present:

Jurors Roy Mardis and Rev. Willie Young, Sr. were absent.

The meeting was opened with a word of Prayer led by Lavelle Penix, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mark Furlow.

Upon motion by Joe Sturges, duly seconded by Mark Furlow, the Jury unanimously voted to adopt the Regular agenda as presented.

Upon motion by George Tigner, III, duly seconded by Lavelle Penix, the Jury unanimously voted to amend the agenda and add the following:

- 3. Request from the Town of Homer, in a letter dated November 19, 2015, requesting one (1) load of cold mix and twenty (20) green u-channel posts (8ft). The work is to be done on a reimbursement basis through the Town's 2015 ad valorem tax credit.

- 4. Request from the Town of Haynesville, in a letter dated November 23, 2015, requesting one (1) load of cold patch to be delivered to the city shop on Spring Street. The work in to be done on a reimbursement basis thru the Town's 2015 ad valorem tax credit.
- 5. Request from Claiborne Parish OEP for approval of their 2016 Budget of \$50,783 of which the Police Jury is responsible for \$25,392 or \$2,115.96 per month. (2015 budget was \$2,054.29 per month).

Considered out of order, President Scott Davidson moved to handle the amendments first due to Senator Gatti's schedule.

At this time, President Scott Davidson welcomed District #36 Senator Ryan Gatti.

Senator Ryan Gatti told the Jury that he knows the lines only cover a portion for his district, but, Senator Gatti looks forward to working with Claiborne Parish as a whole.

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by Jerry Adkins, the Jury unanimously adopted the North LA Criminalistics Laboratory's 2015 proposed budget amendments and the 2016 proposed budget as required by LA R.S. 40:22678.

Upon motion by Gorge Tigner, III, duly seconded by Joe Sturges, the Jury unanimously approved the proposed bid specs from Road Superintendent Tommy Durrett, for the advertising and purchase of a new asphalt spray truck for the Hwy. Dept.

Upon motion by Jerry Adkins, duly seconded by Lavelle Penix, the Jury unanimously approved, upon recommendation from the Grants Committee, the submission of the 2015-2016 LGAP Applications by January 8, 2016. These projects will be Pinehill Water System Re-Coating of Tank and South Claiborne Water System Automatic Transfer Switches for Generators.

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR THE FY 2015-2016 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM GRANT DUE JANUARY 8, 2015

WHEREAS, the FY 2015-2016 Local Government Assistance Program provides financial assistance to the local units of government in rural areas for the sole purpose of improving or rehabilitating certain qualified projects;

WHEREAS, the FY 2015-2016 LGAP Grant will be administered by the Office of Community Development (OCD); and

WHEREAS, the grant application and guidelines require a resolution of support from the local governing authority; and

WHEREAS, the Claiborne Parish Police Jury is applying for up to \$100,000 of FY 2015-2016 LGAP grant monies at the parish level; and

WHEREAS, the Claiborne Parish Police Jury intends to use these grant monies on up to possibly (2) two projects for the Claiborne Parish Police Jury (1) \$50,000 for the Pine Hill Water System Hwy 79 standpipe painting and refurbishing and (2) \$50,000 for the South Claiborne

Water System for the installation of three automatic transfer switches on existing emergency generators; and

WHEREAS, the Claiborne Parish Police Jury will be providing local funds up to \$10,000 to ensure completion of the awarded project;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Claiborne Parish Police Jury does hereby approve and support this grant application and its purpose.

President Scott Davidson reminded everyone the Christmas 2015 Holiday will begin at lunch on Wednesday 12/23, off Thursday 12/24 until Friday 1/1/2016 and return to work on Monday, January 4, 2016.

Upon motion by George Tigner, III, duly seconded by Mark Furlow, the Jury unanimously awarded the lowest qualified bids on the purchase of MC-30 Prime Oil, CRS-2, SS-1, AEP, and AC-10 asphalt necessary for the maintenance of Claiborne Parish Roads for the year 2016 to the Ergon for the following amounts:

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by Joe Sturges, the Jury unanimously awarded the lowest qualified by on the purchase of SS-1oil asphalt necessary for the maintenance of Claiborne Parish Roads for the year 2016 to Asphalt Products in the amount of \$1.79 per gallon.

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by George Tigner, III, the Jury unanimously awarded the lowest qualified bid on the purchase of Hot Mix and Cold Mix necessary for the maintenance of Claiborne Parish roads for the year 2016 to Amethyst Construction for Hot Mix at \$76.00 per ton and Cold Mix at \$85.00 per ton.

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by Joe Sturges, the Jury unanimously awarded the lowest qualified bid for the purchase of pit run and maintenance rock to be picked up by our trucks to Standard Gravel in the amount of \$4.75 per ton for Pit Run and \$8.25 per ton for Maintenance Rock.

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by Joe Sturges, the Jury unanimously awarded the lowest qualified bid for the purchase of pit run and maintenance rock delivered to our destination, to Blann Trucking in the amount of \$15.50 for Pit Run delivered and \$22.25 Maintenance Rock delivered.

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by Joe Sturges, the Jury unanimously awarded the lowest qualified bid for the purchase of LA C-1 delivered to our destination, to Ruston Rock It in the amount of \$37.25 per ton.

Upon motion by Joe Sturges, duly seconded by George Tigner, III, the Jury unanimously awarded the lowest qualified bid for the purchase of LA-C2, LA-C3, and SB-2 delivered to our pit, to Blann Trucking in the amount of \$37.00 per ton for LA-C2 and LA-C3 and \$30.00 for SB-2 and pickup SB-2 \$22.00 per ton.

Upon motion by Mark Furlow, duly seconded by Joe Sturges, the Jury unanimously awarded the lowest qualified bid for the purchase of 87 Octane Unleadede Gasoline and Diesel Fuel (off-road & highway use) for use by Parish Owned Vehicles for the year 2016 to Crump Oil with the amount being .0629 over OPIS PETRISTAT for all types of fuel.

Upon motion by George Tigner, III, duly seconded by Mark Furlow, the Jury unanimously approved the quote from Keith Lee of Lisbon for the purchase of iron ore and clay in Area 5 for the cost of \$1.00 per cubic yard for use by the Claiborne Parish Hwy Department.

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by Jerry Adkins, the Jury unanimously approved the request from Claiborne Parish Fire Protection District #3, in an email received November 4, 2015, requesting that the Police Jury accept the resignation of Mr. Paul Brazzel from the Fire District #3 Board. District 2 Juror Mark Furlow recused himself from the discussion and the vote.

Upon motion by Joe Sturges, duly seconded by George Tigner, III, the Jury unanimously approved the request from Claiborne Parish Fire Protection District #3, in an email received November 4, 2015, requesting that the Police Jury appoint Mr. Rush Ware to fill the unexpired portion of Mr. Paul Brazzel's term on the Fire District #3 Board. District 2 Juror Mark Furlow recused himself from the discussion and the vote.

Upon motion by Joe Sturges, duly seconded by Mark Furlow, the Jury unanimously approved the request from North Claiborne Hospital Service District No. 1, in a letter received November 13, 2016 to replace Mr. Dump Hatter whose term ends on December 31, 2015.

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by Joe Sturges, the Jury unanimously approved the request from the Claiborne Memorial Medical Center, in a letter received November 19, 2015, requesting the Police Jury to reappoint Mr. Al Faulk to the HSD#3 Board. Mr. Faulk's term expires on December 31, 2015.

Upon motion by George Tigner, III, duly seconded by Mark Furlow, the Jury unanimously approved the request from Road Superintendent Tommy Durrett, to hire Mike Ellis as a Class A Truck Driver effective December 17, 2015 for \$11.00 per hour. Mr. Ellis is currently working for the Parish the Manpower.

Upon motion by Lavelle Penix, duly seconded by Joe Sturges, the Jury unanimously approved the approval of the 2016 Worker's Comp quote from Stonetrust in the amount of \$38,147.

Upon motion by Jerry Adkins, duly seconded by George Tigner, III, the Jury unanimously approved the proposed 2015 budget amendments.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of Claiborne Parish, Louisiana, in a regular called session, the Ordinance adopting an Operating Budget for Revenues and Expenditures for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2016 and ending December 31, 2016.

RESOLUTION 2015-021 - AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION

Authorizing Resolution 2016

Resolution authorizing the filing of an application with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development for grants through the US DOT Federal Transit Administration (FTA), as authorized under Federal Transit Laws, as codified, 49 USC Section 5317, New Freedom Program and executing with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development upon project approval.

WHEREAS, the Director of the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development is authorized to make grants for a New Freedom projects;

WHEREAS, the contract for financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon the applicant, including the provisions by it of the local share of project costs in the program;

WHEREAS, it is required by the U.S. Department of Transportation in accordance with the provisions of the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance under 49 USC Section 5317 the applicant give an assurance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the U.S. Department of Transportation requirements thereunder, and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the applicant that the disadvantaged business enterprise be used to the fullest extent possible in connection with this/these project(s), and that definite procedures shall be established and administered to ensure that disadvantaged businesses shall have the maximum construction contracts, supplies, equipment, or consultant and other services:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Claiborne Parish Police Jury:

- 1. That the <u>Parish President</u> is authorized to execute and file an application(s) on behalf of <u>Claiborne Parish Police Jury</u> with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development, to aid in the financing of operating assistance projects pursuant to the New Freedom Program, USC 5317.
- 2. That the <u>Parish President</u> is authorized to execute and file with such applications and assurance or any other document required by the U.S. Department of Transportation and Development effectuating the purpose of the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
- 3. That the <u>Parish President</u> is authorized to furnish such additional information as the Louisiana Department of Transportation and the Development may require in connection with the application for the program of projects submitted to FTA.
- 4. That the <u>Parish President</u> is authorized to set forth and execute affirmative disadvantaged business policies in connection to any procurement made as part of the project.
- 5. That the <u>Parish President</u> is authorized to execute grant contract agreements on the behalf of <u>Claiborne Parish Police Jury</u> with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development for aid in the financing of operating assistance projects.

After much discussion between Pafford EMS, Jurors, Claiborne Parish Emergency Personnel, and CMMC physicians (Dr. Mark Haynes and Dr. Sam Abshire) on the protocol used for determining where injured patients being taken in regard to other hospitals and bypassing CMMC, President Davidson thanked Mr. Wold and Pafford for coming and told them he hoped that we could get this issue worked for the benefit and well-being of the citizens of the Parish and that the various agencies involved in the Parish can work closely with the EMS provider to achieve this goal.
