Kevin Gray gave a brief update on the ongoing projects of the Building Committee. He stated the Jury is progressing with plans to repair the roof at the CPSO, which will hopefully stop the leaks. Also, the committee is prioritizing the list of needed repairs inside the women's jail. The CID building employees has requested a possible handrail for the front entrance. Also, in the rehab work at the Tax Assessor's Office and the Clerk of Courts is progressing.

President Scott Davidson reminded everyone of the PJAL Convention February 15-17, 2017 at the Golden Nugget Casino in Lake Charles.

At this time, Parish Coroner Dr. Mark Haynes, gave an update for the monthly coroner's report. He stated there were 10 deaths, (4) required autopsies, (5) Hospice/ER, (1) on scene, and (1) Committal.
